## **Preface**

I am immensely happy to know that Haryana Police has prepared a Driving Manual for enhancing awareness about traffic laws, statutes and road regulations, and also for upgrading the driving skills of prospective drivers.

Lack of driving sense and perpetual disobedience of traffic rules has made our roads extremely unsafe. It does not come as a surprise that most of the drivers of motor vehicles, pedestrians, cyclists and even the traffic police personnel managing and controlling traffic on the roads are not fully aware of traffic rules and regulations. Lack of driving skills is the single most important cause of traffic accidents in the country. With increasing population and rising economic prosperity, lakhs of new drivers are added to our roads every year. The situation on road safety front will not improve unless the prospective drivers are imparted proper training in driving. One of the very important steps to bring some discipline on the road and prevent accidents is to offer quality driver training and implement an effective licensing system. This driving manual is a step in that direction and will go a long way in helping improve the driving skills of our people. It is an excellent effort for which I congratulate Shri Shatrujeet Kapur, IPS, Additional Director General of Police and his team for showing the way and preparing the second edition of this manual, which is a first of its kind in the country.
